However, the Jersey Shore is full of great things to do with your family even when the skies are overcast. For some ideas, here's a sampling of a few things that cost a few dollars but offer your family unique fun and lasting memories.

The area is full of great miniature golf courses, each one offering its own special features. Island Miniature Golf at 4501 New Jersey Ave. in Wildwood is one of the area's newest miniature golf courses and has been voted the "best on the island" and was recently a finalist for Best Miniature Golf in South Jersey by the AC Press. An 85 minute trip across the Delaware Bay is an enjoyable adventure. Whether you're crossing the Delaware Bay for a fun day trip or as part of a long-distance trip on the Cape May-Lewes Ferry, your journey is sure to be a memorable one. Enjoy historic lighthouses, picturesque harbors, ocean-going vessels, unique seabirds and, just maybe, your very own dolphin escort! There are many ships that offer great fun on the water. The Silver Bullet in Wildwood and the Cape May Whale Watcher and the Cape May Whale Watch and Research Center offer you a trip on the water with a chance to view whales and dolphins.

Cloudy days at the shore are a great way to try your hand at "thrifting". Cape May and Atlantic Counties are full of thrift stores that offer great products and discounted prices. You can start your day in Cape May checking out the great antique shops all over town. Head off the island to Et Cetera Thrift at 3845 Bayshore Road in North Cape May, and then just make a short trip to the Veterans and Patriots of Cape May County Thrift Store in the Bayshore Plaza at Bayshore and Breakwater Roads. Head up to Villas and you will find Luv Thrift and St Barnabas Thrift. On your way to Wildwood, stop in to St Mary's This & That in Rio Grande. In Wildwood, there are numerous thrifts you can browse. Check out Cheap Charlie's at 4724 Pacific Ave., for a great selection of clothing, housewares and much more. Jump on to Route 9 after leaving Wildwood and your day of thrifting can continue with a visit to Volunteers in Medicine Thrift Store in the Grapevine Plaza at 7 North Wildwood Blvd, and Et Cetera's second location in the Acme Shopping Center in Cape May Court House. Continue north on Route 9 and you will pass various antique and collectible shope along the way. When you hit Swainton on Route 9, you'll find Coho Antiques at the intersection of Rt 9 and Goshen Swainton Rd. See the map on page 16 for some help with your day of thrifting.

Going to Cape May is a great way to spend a cloudy day. Here you will find the The Emlen Physick Estate, a Victorian house museum located at 1048 Washington Street. The 18-room mansion, attributed to acclaimed American architect Frank Furness, was built in 1879 for Dr. Emlen Physick Jr. (1855-1916), descendant of a well-known Philadelphia family, his widowed mother, Mrs. Ralston, and maiden Aunt Emilie. The mansion is closely related to Furness's Knowlton Mansion (1880-81) in Northeast Philadelphia.

A Favorite among locals and visitors is the Naval Air Station Wildwood (NASW) Aviation Museum, a non-profit museum located at the Cape May Airport just off of Breakwater Road in Lower Township, inside historic Hangar #1. Commissioned in April 1943, NASW served as an active dive-bomber squadron training facility during World War II. Today, Hangar #1 has been restored and transformed into an Aviation Museum that houses a number of aircraft, engines, special exhibits, and educational interactive displays. The museum invites visitors to explore aviation, New Jersey, military and WWII history through "hands-on," fun and educational activities for the entire family! Bring the kids and travel back in time to this 92,000 square foot sampling of the 1940's (and don't forget your camera)! Also travel back in time with a visit to Historic Cold Spring Village at 735 Seashore Rd in Cape May. Here, the 1800s come to life when you visit restored, preserved buildings on a 30-acre site. Historically clothed interpreters demonstrate black-smithing, printing, woodworking, basket weaving, bookbinding and more!

South Jersey is full of great wineries and breweries which make for a great way to spend a cloudy day. They offer indoor and outdoor seating, plus the breweries offer alcohol-free sodas for a kid-friendly environment. You can drop in to the Cape May Brewery at the Cape May Airport after checking out the Aviation Museum, cruise over to Cold Spring Brewery at Cold Spring Village in North Cape May, or visit Anglesea Aleworks at 3401 New Jersey Ave in Wildwood (the Sea Pig is Awesome!!), and a short trek northward will allow you to discover the awesome brews at Ludlam Island Brewery in Woodbine. Whatever you choose to do, and no matter what the weather, please enjoy and make it a great day! Thanks for reading!!







WILDWOOD DOG BEACH - The Wildwood Dog Park and Beach, located between Glenwood and Maple Avenues, is hard to miss — there is a monumental red fire hydrant sculpture along the fence. In that vein, this amusement park-adjacent dog beach is the closest thing you might find to an instagram attraction for your pups. Giant tires and a massive beach chair provide fun for climbing and great photo ops. There are designated areas for larger and smaller breeds. Local pet parents agree that this is a prime place for dogs to stretch their four legs and socialize. Dog-Friendly Features: Fresh water and cleanup bags are offered on site. Hours and Rules: The park is open daily, dawn to dusk, and dogs can roam free within the fenced area. However, canines on the dog beach must be leashed. Uses I have a social pet parents agree that this is a prime place for dogs to stretch their four legs and socialize. Dog-Friendly Features: Fresh water and cleanup bags are offered on site. Hours and Rules: The park is open daily, dawn to dusk, and dogs can roam free within the fenced area. However, canines on the dog beach must be leashed. ASBURY PARK DOG BEACH - Better known as the 8th Avenue dog beach by local, sabury Park's dedicated stretch of shoreline is a hound haven. Wellbehaved pooches are welcome off leash to splash and zoom around within the fenced at all times.

LONGPORT DOG BEACH - Located in Egg Harbor, Longport Dog Beach is also known as Somers Point Dog Beach or Malibu Dog Beach. Whatever you want call it, this beach at Ocean Drive Bridge, across from the fishing pier, offers ocal, sabury Park's dedicated stretch of shoreline is a hound haven. to 6 p.m. The same rules are in effect for the hip Asbury Boardwalk. But dogs are allowed to be off-leash on the beach anytime of day between September 15 and May 15. Dog owners must immediately pick up after their dogs or could face up to \$1,000 in fines.

BRIGANTINE DOG BEACH - The Brigantine North End Dog Beach is close to the Absecon Wildlife Management Area as well as the scenic Edwin B. Forsythe National Wildlife Refuge. Bring your wild pup to this dog beach just outside Atlantic City for a romp year-round on a 6-foot leash. The area offers free parking and stretches from the beginning of the sea wall to the nature preserve. Be wary of horse flies and other beach bugs that are more prevalent in the humid summer months, especially once the wind dies down.

leash at this New Jersey beach. Hours and Rules: Open year round from sunrise to sunset. There are no waste receptacles, so you will have to clean up and carry out your dog's waste. Parking rules need to be obeyed and they do ticket for parking violations.

MANASQUAN DOG BEACH - The Fisherman's Cove Conservation Area is a tract in the Manasquan Inlet and one of NJ's beaches that allows dogs, with a dedicated area welcoming leashed pets. More commonly referred to as Manasquan's dog beach, well-behaved pups will enjoy the views and the surf, especially at low tide. The beach can be a bit rocky, but many pets and parents still enjoy the friendly ambiance of this Jersey Shore spot. Dog-Friendly Features: There is an on-site hydration station for thirsty pups. The nearby Riverside Cafe — open seasonally — is uber pet-friendly with patio seating and fresh water and treats for your canine companion. Hours and Rules: Dogs are welcome with a leash during the day on the east portion of the beach. A Light(House) to Guide You: Historic Lighthouses in Cape May & Atlantic Counties

Lighthouses have guarded the New Jersey coast for centuries, lining the Atlantic Ocean and the Delaware Bay to warn vessels traveling the coast. While exact numbers vary depending on who you ask, the United States Coast Guard has identified 23 lighthouses in New Jersey. Here are a few of the most historic, beginning with the southernmost near our terminal in Cape May and heading up the coast to Sandy Hook, and dating as far back as the Revolutionary War.

Cape May Lighthouse - Location: Cape May • Year built: 1859 • With 199 steps to the top, the Cape May Lighthouse is one that is extremely special to us here at the Cape May-Lewes Ferry. Now maintained by the Mid Atlantic Center for the Arts & Humanities (MAC), the lighthouse has been open to the public to climb for over 30 years. It is the third documented lighthouse to be built in Cape May, the other two now underwater due to erosion. The lighthouse was automated in 1946 and still is operational to this day. Approximately 2.1 million people have paid to climb the lighthouse since it was opened it to the public! Interested in exploring this Cape May landmark for yourself?



Hereford Inlet Lighthouse - Location: North Wildwood • Year built: 1874 • Designed by Paul Pelz, who would later go on to design the Library of Congress in Washington DC, the Hereford Lighthouse was built on the coast of the Hereford Inlet upon the recommendation of the United Sates Life-Saving Service, due to shifting sandbars and strong currents in the inlet. It only took the United States Life-Saving Service one year on the Hereford Inlet before recognizing the need for a lighthouse in the area and making the recommendation. Now, over 140 years later and officially listed on the State and National Registers of Historic Places, it offers a beautiful museum, information center and amazing gardens.

Absecon Lighthouse - Location: Atlantic City • Year built: 1857 • While the Absecon lighthouse is still lit, it is no longer considered a functional navigation aid. However, it is still NJ's tallest lighthouse, and the third tallest in the US. With 228 steps open for climbing, this historic ascent brings you to the lighthouse's original first-order Fresnel lens, as well as a view of the Atlantic City skyline. The Absecon Lighthouse is on both the New Jersey and the National Registry of Historic Places.

AVALON - 2024 Fees: \$8 Daily; \$17 weekly; \$40 Season. Children 11 and under free; Active duty military members and their immediate families also may enjoy the beaches with free tags. For your protection, bathing and swimming are permitted only at protected beaches where lifeguards are on duty 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM through Labor Day weekend. Purchase beach tags at the Avalon Tax Collector's Office located inside Avalon Borough Hall, 3100 Dune Drive, Avalon Beach Tag Booth adjacent to Community Hall at 30th Street and the beach, or at www.jerseycapetags.com/avalon-beachtags. All parking is free. Municipal lots at 28th-30th streets and beach, 32nd and Dune Drive behind borough hall, 21st Street and 5th Avenue, and off Ocean Drive at 20th Street. Surfing at 30th Street beach and either side of 12th Street station away from bathers. Rafting and other inflatable flotation devices permitted at 12 beach areas between 9th and 78th streets. The playing of volleyball and Frisbee is permitted on the beach between 38th Street and 76th Street will the exact locations to be designated by and under the control of the Beach Patrol Captain; and, also at 31st Street behind Community Hall. No pets, fires, alcohol allowed. Limited vehicle access by permit only. Info at avalonboro.net or (609) 967-8200.

CAPE MAY - 2024 Beach access fees: \$10 Daily; \$25 weekly; \$40 Season. Children 11 and under free; Active duty military members and their immediate families also may enjoy the beaches with free tags. Beach tags are required while lifeguards are on duty and all tags can be purchased at the Beach Tag Headquarters, 704 Beach Avenue, promenade klosks at Howard, Gurney, Madison Avenue, and Broadway or at www.jersey-cape-tags.myshopify.com/collections/capemay/products/cape-may-2024-seasonal-beach-tags. Beach front metered parking. Skimboarding is allowed with the permission of the lifeguards. Volleyball nets are available at Steger Beach (Beach Ave & Jackson 5t) and at 2nd Avenue Beach (2nd Avenue & Beach Ave). They're located on the beach, so you will need a beach tag to play, and please BYOB (bring your own ball). Surfing is permitted at Poverty Beach (Wilmington Avenue), The Cove, Surfing Beach (Gurney Street), and South Queen (Queen Street). During guarded hours, fishing is permitted along the quarter-mile stretch east of the Brooklyn Avenue storm pipe. Fishing is prohibited at all other beaches during guarded hours. Kayaking is permitted past the bathing zone. You can launch east of Poverty Beach and west of The Cove stand. Please don't walk or climb on the jetties. Fires and bonfires are not permitted on the beach. You can bring prepared food, but no portable device may be used for cooking on the beach. Stay hydrated, but alcohol is prohibited. CAPE MAY POINT STATE PARK - This state park is free to the public, It's an ideal location for birding, picnics, and nature walks. Explore ponds, coastal dunes, marshes, and forest habitat. The beach is home to endangered birds, so pets are not permitted on the beach from April 1–September 15. Cape May Point State Park is also home to the Cape May Lighthouse, which you can climb for a fee. Free on-site parking. You can also rent the 60-person group picnic area year-round. SUNSET BEACH - Located at the end of Sunset Avenue, Sunset Beach is in Lower Township so you don't need a beach tag. Sunset Beach is smoke free, has free on-site parking, gift shops, food, mini golf, and is home to the SS Atlantus, an experimental concrete ship wrecked offshore. Evening flae geremonies at Sunset Beach: June - Saturdays at 7pm. July & August - Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday at 7pm. The last ceremony of the year is the Saturday of Labor Day Weekend at 7pm. 


Summer Crunch Salad

Ingredients:

- 1 medium sized cucumber, lightly peeled and roughly chopped
- 1 pint cherry tomatoes, sliced in half
- 1 large or 2 smaller bell peppers, seeded and roughly chopped
- 1/2 of a red onion peeled and roughly chopped
- 1 1/2 cups fresh corn kernels (from about 2 ears of fresh sweet corn)
- 1/4 cup finely chopped parsley
- 3 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- salt and pepper
- · pinch of crushed red pepper flakes
- a heaping 1/2 cup of crumbled goat cheese or feta cheese

Preparation

In a large bowl toss together all the chopped veggies with salt, pepper and crushed red pepper flakes. Drizzle with the oil and vinegar. Taste for seasoning and then crumble with the goat cheese. Store the salad in the fridge for up to 5 days Swap out the onion for scallions or leeks if need be. Feel free to use any fresh herb in place of the parsley or a combination of herbs.



Ingredients:

Hot Sauce:

- 1 cup hot sauce
- 1/2 cup molasses
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter

Wings:

- · 2 tablespoons light brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon kosher salt
- 2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 2 teaspoons smoked paprika
- · 2 teaspoons freshly ground black pepper
- 3/4 cup olive oil, plus extra for oiling the grill
- 3 pounds whole chicken wings
- 1/2 cup thinly-sliced scallions (cut on a bias), optional
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley, optional


Preparation

Preheat a grill or grill pan at medium-high heat.

For the sauce: Mix together the hot sauce, molasses and butter in a small pot. Heat until combined; set aside. For the wings: Whisk together the brown sugar, salt, garlic powder, smoked paprika and pepper in a bowl. Whisk the oil into the dry mixture, creating a loose rub. Set a quarter of the mixture aside to use for brushing. Slather the wings with the rub. Brush the grill grates with a little olive oil, then add the wings to the grill. Cook, covered, for about 10 minutes, then baste with the reserved rub mixture. Flip and baste with any remaining rub and cook for another 15 minutes. Remove the wings from the grill and toss with the hot sauce in a large bowl. Transfer to a platter and sprinkle with the scallions and parsley, if using.



PROTECTING OUR PETS IN THE HEAT

IN THE HEAT

I have addressed the problem with having pets in hot cars, even with the windows slightly open on all sides. I have a lease car now that allows for auto start, so I can leave Zoey in the AC as I run into the library, or the Produce Place, and yet I am still nervous that it may shut off. The temperature in a car with the windows open slightly can reach 102 degrees in ten minutes. After 30 minutes, 120 degrees. Your pet may either die or suffer permanent organ damage.

According to Dr. Barry Kellogg, VMD of the Humane Society Veterinary Medical Association humidity is also a concern. "Animals pant to evaporate moisture from their lungs, which takes heat away from their body. If the humidity is too high, they are unable to cool themselves and their temperature will skyrocket to dangerous levels-very quickly." Zoey is a Maltese and has a short muzzle, like boxers, pugs, shih tzus bull dogs and others and it makes it even harder for them to breathe. Ebby is part chihuahua, part cocker spaniel and very heat sensitive. She is also black so I bought her a cooling vest. I am extra careful with them in the car.

Exercise is great for dogs, but a parent must be aware of how much running your dog does to catch that ball or frisbee. Some dogs push themselves to excess and they can become in danger of heat stroke. It happened to Parker once, and it wasn't even hot. I carried him into the laundry sink and cooled his legs with tepid water and ran some over his body. Then let him lick on ice cubes. It was very scary. Exercise should be limited to early morning or evening hours when things have noticeably cooled down, especially hot roads. Asphalt can burn their paws so walk on grass as much as possible. Proper walking etiquette for dogs is to walk them on your left, facing traffic, and keeping the dog on the inside, preferably on the grass. Keep yourself and your dog hydrated. We have a supply of travel water holders, as well as treat bags. You can buy cooling vests, cooling scarves and cooling mats as well. Make popsicles for your pet or buy canvas bones like we have that can be put in the freezer. Some dogs would enjoy a cooling soak in a bathtub or pet pool.

Fans do not cool pets like they cool humans. If you use a fan have one that is ground level so it can keep your pets' feet cool as they sweat through their feet. If your pet spends time outside, confine them to shady areas, and provide cool water with added ice cubes. If you don't have trees, a tarp can be erected that will provide shade and still allow for air flow.

SAND IMPACTION CAN BE DEADLY FOR A DOG

While romping on the beach, your dog may inadvertently ingest sand from the ball or frisbee you toss, digging in the sand and eating something tasty left behind, ingesting water while retrieving a toy thrown in the surf, consuming particles flung into the air by running children or other dogs or from shaking out a towel or blanket (saltwater poisoning can be an issue as well). Although the sand particles are small, they become a condensed, wet, heavy mass which could possibly cause a blockage in the intestinal tract. The symptoms you should look for are unusual "restlessness, panting, vomiting, dehydration, abdominal pain, hard mass in the stomach area and constipation." If you see these symptoms, take your pet to the vet asap.


Ingredients:


